Alcoholism has many victims but perhaps the most defenseless of them are the children of alcoholics. Instead of their parents being sources of wisdom and nurturing, such children have to survive with adults who are violent, unpredictable, and given to their own impulses and desires. Children of alcoholics face risks of mental health trauma and substance abuse in their own adult years, but whether they make the choices of their parents is a complex issue.

Children of alcoholics (COAs) are children who have grown up in families in which either one or both parents are alcoholic. According to the "National Survey on extent, pattern and trends of drugs abuse in India," the prevalence of alcoholism is 21.4%.^[1] In America, approximately one in ten is a drinker, and many of them are married and have families and children.

Psychiatric morbidity in children of alcoholic parents

Children raised in alcoholic families have different life experiences than children raised in non-alcoholic families. Children raised in other types of dysfunctional families may have similar developmental losses and stressors as do children raised in alcoholic families.

Children of Alcoholics: Important Facts

Studies show that children of alcoholics constitute a population at-risk commonly for poor performance, skipping school days, and school drop out. The focus of the present study was to examine a variety of direct outcome variables measuring academic performance among a sample of 226 children, 108 of them from parents who misused alcohol in Cadiz.

School Characteristics among Children of Alcoholic Parents ...

Findings from a prospective study on the development of vulnerability for alcoholism among (initially) preschool-age children showed that children from families with antisocial alcoholism differ on a number of indicators of child risk, including measures of risky temperament, externalizing behavior problems, and hyperactivity.

The Development of Alcoholic Subtypes

Children of Drug Abusers and Alcoholics. Children of Drug Abusers and Alcoholics is an early intervention program for high-risk children 4 to 10 years of age who live with at least one parent (or guardian) addicted to alcohol and/or other drugs. The program consisted of two 12-week components, one for children and one for families.
