This representation of the invisible discrimination the Filipinos had to deal with is a stark, cynical one that neither romanticizes nor overly victimizes the Filipino.

Filipinos Depicted in American Culture

In California, Filipinos could not marry white women or even own property. Signs that read "positively no Filipinos allowed" were displayed openly on

hotels and other businesses around Stockton.
