Child Protection and Safeguarding Policy and Procedures

Safeguarding means protecting children who may be at risk from harm, abuse and neglect. Schools, nurseries and play centres along with their safeguarding procedures, play an essential role in protecting children and young people by creating a safe environment, ensuring that adults who work in the school, including volunteers, don't pose a risk to children.

The UK's four nations - England, Northern Ireland, Scotland and Wales - each have their own child protection system and laws to help protect children from abuse and neglect. Each nation has a framework of legislation, guidance and practice to identify children who are at risk of harm, take action to protect those children and prevent further abuse occurring.

2.4 Every pupil should feel safe and protected from any form of abuse which, in this policy, means any kind of physical abuse, emotional abuse, sexual abuse or neglect (see point 4.2 below). All children without exception have the right to protection from abuse regardless of gender, ethnicity, disability, sexuality, or beliefs.
